Gynaecomasty

Instructions for the Patient

Before the Intervention:

- If you are having a full anaesthetic, do not eat, drink or smoke after midnight.
- Taking Aspirin (or any other medication containing acetyl salicylic acid) is forbidden during the ten days before the intervention;
- No alcohol 2 days before the intervention;
- On the day of the operation, you are advised not to wear any make-up, nor any nail varnish.
- On the day of the operation, you are advised not to wear contact lenses.
- On the day of the operation, you are advised <u>not to wear</u> any **jewellery** OR **piercings**.
- In the morning before the intervention, the body must be washed with a disinfectant soap of the Hibiscrub, Uni-Cura or Betadermyl variety (available from chemists).

For a gynaecomasty, it is important and obligatory to wear anti-embolic stockings on the day of your surgery. Please provide the long ones up to above the knees. These you can buy at the pharmacy or at our clinic (30£).

After the Intervention:

- After the intervention, a specific compression bandage must be worn for a month, day and night. The panty can be briefly taken off after 48 hours, for a quick shower.
- Waterproof dressings are placed after the intervention in order to protect the stitches. They will be removed at the same time as the stitches, i.e. a fortnight after the intervention.
- You are advised to take Dafalgan (Paracetamol) at a rate of 1gr four times a day, alternating with Ibuprofen 600mg, three times a day and, possibly, Oxynorm instant 5mg, twice a day. This latter medication should be discontinued in the event of nausea.
- Antibiotics will be prescribed for you and must be taken two times a day until the box is empty.
- An oedema will appear after the operation, but it will disappear of its own accord. This may take a couple of weeks.
- The stitches will be removed after a 14 days, by your doctor or at Beclinic. Sometimes no stitches have to be removed as the scar will be glued. This will be mentioned in your personal letter given after your surgery.
- Once the stitches have been removed, the doctor will place some steristrips and a waterproof dressing, which will be removed after three days. The scars can be massaged with Cicalfate (Avène) or Alhydran cream. One month after the surgery, a silicon dressing (of the "Bapscarcare", "Cerederm" or " Dermatix" variety) can be applied in order to encourage the healing process. The scars absolutely must be kept out of the sun for at least a year.
- You are advised not to carry any heavy objects nor to practise any sport for four weeks after the intervention.
- Eight weeks after the intervention, a check-up at Beclinic is advised.

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
